Lion Shop & Share is a simple and convenient way to raise money for the church. Each time you shop at Food Lion and use your MVP card, a portion of your total grocery purchase will be donated to the church. Funds are totaled quarterly and sent to the church. You will need to link your MVP card number to the church

by recording your MVP card number (12 digit number on the back of the card) on the chart in the Gathering Room. Twenty-five (25) card numbers are needed to start the program, so please bring your card and sign up. You may contact Eric Stumb with any additional questions or concerns.

## Kroger Cares — Order your card today!

The Kroger Cares program involves the purchase of a special card, which you then use to make your purchases of groceries, gasoline, or pharmacy items. The card may be ordered in the Gathering Room today; the cost is \$5 which you may then spend at Kroger. You may add additional funds to the card for shopping, and continue to do so to replenish it as you shop.

The accumulating amounts of monies (for cards purchased by the Church and all funds "loaded" onto the cards) are placed into our Kroger Cares account. When that account reaches a total of \$5,000, Kroger will make a contribution of 5% to Central (\$250). The account then resets to zero and we begin working toward the next rebate

Funds received from both the Kroger and Food Lion programs will benefit our Fellowship Fund (the Pastor's Discretionary Helping Fund) and Food Pantry.

#### KITS FOR ANNUAL CONFERENCE

**Our Goal: 25 – 30 Kits** 

The 2009 Virginia Conference kit collection is being conducted to replenish the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) supply. UMCOR's Sager Brown Depot reports there is a need for all types of kits (except flood buckets).

You're invited to donate a kit—you may assemble the kit or give an offering to have UMCOR purchase items for it. Lists of kit items are included in our current newsletter and available in the Gathering Room.

\*Birthing Kit (New) – \$8 Health Kit – \$12, plus \$1 for toothpaste School Kit – \$11 Baby/Layette Kit – \$35 Sewing Kit – \$18



Important: All items must be new. All emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations. Since strict rules often govern product entry into international countries, it is important that kits contain only the requested items — nothing more. Do not include any personal notes, money, or additional materials in the kits. These things must be removed and will delay the shipment. If possible, please include an additional \$1 to help with shipping costs.

### \*Birthing Kit contents

Place these items inside a sealed one-gallon plastic bag:

1 hotel-size bar of soap (1 ounce and up)

1 pair of clean latex gloves

1 square yard of clear 4 mil plastic sheeting

3 pieces of clean string, each 12" long

1 clean single-use razor blade (carefully wrap the blade in paper or plastic to protect it and keep it from causing injury)

2 flannelette receiving blankets, each 1 square yard
